Shady Hollow Annexation Committee Meeting

The Shady Hollow Annexation committee met Wednesday, July 19th @ 7:00pm at the Shady Hollow Community center. The meeting was held by Jim Bateman and Geoff Lawson. About 50 were in attendance for the discussion of Sen-



ate Bill 6 and House Bill 6, filed in Special Session of the Texas Legislature regarding the right to vote on annexation. These bills would make it possible for residents of an area slated for annexation to have to right to vote on whether or not they want to be annexed. State Rep. Paul Workman, R-Austin (our state representative here in Shady Hollow) ensured that a provision



residents of the Shady Hollow and River Place neighborhoods these voting rights, regardless of the fact that the City of Austin has already implemented annexation procedures.

Several members spoke including Dr. Ron Stried, President of the Shady Hollow MUD, who discussed the MUD agreement with the City of Austin and how this bill could possibly affect that agreement. Bill Aleshire, former Travis County Judge, stated his support for Rep. Paul Workman on this bill, and also mentioned that annexation is a tool that cities use to increase revenue. He also said that in the history of Travis County, the county never increased its

size and was always able to operate within its budget. He said, "even those opposed to annexation should support this bill."

Jim Bateman and Geoff Lawson drafted a resolution in support of the bills, which was passed by the Shady Hollow Board of Directors. Jim Bateman presented the resolution to the Senate Committee that was considering Senate Bill 6 by Senator Donna Campbell, R-San Antonio. Senate Bill 6 was passed by the Senate and was being debated in the House of Representatives as of August 10th. Representative Workman's provision that would give Shady Hollow residents the right to vote was stripped out of the version of the bill passed by the House Committee, but Representative Workman is expected to propose an amendment to get it reinserted. Managers Report - Darin Laracuente

Office

The newsletter went out later so that it could include 4th of July information

The payment portal for HOA dues was used by 11 members

A petition to change some covenants has until August 17th to be submitted to the HOA.

Working with Craig Murray soon to come to an agreement on tennis lessons for kids in Shady Hollow.

Finance

A communication email to explain the new payment portal was delayed while work on the portal was under way.

Our expenditures are \$8,200 under our monthly budget for June and \$12,000 under budget on the year. We are \$9,500 behind what we expected to bring in as far as assessment collections are concerned and \$40,000 behind on our income on the year.

Deed Restriction Violations

Total violations contacted during the month - 68. Resolved as of todays meeting - 59.

Pool

Due to high demand for adult swim keys this year more keys had to be made

We have only had to shut down the pool three times this year due to incidents

The pool seems to be losing water at a much quicker rate of late. Our pool maintenance company (ACS) is checking to see if it can be slowed or if we have to ride it out until the end of the season and get it repaired at the same time we do the decking, replaster, etc.

A chemical delivery truck knocked part of our pool gate off. ACS is taking responsibility for all damage.

The A/C unit for the pool house is failing. **Parks**

Capistrano Park - The new trees are doing well.

Doe Run Park - Tree cutting and removal was performed ahead of the City of Austin's planned cutting

Gatling gun - Tree work was performed.

There is still some debris to be removed and the sprinkler line seems to be repaired at one point

Shady Hollow West Park - A sprinkler audit is schedule for the end of July

Community Center

All phase I renovation work has been completed.

The windows have been tinted and the conference rooms have been cooler

The capacitor went out on one of our East Room A/C units

The concrete table and bench tops on the East and West Room patios were replaced.



The MUD Board held its regular monthly meeting on July 10, 2017 at the MUD Office Building, 3910 Capistrano Trail. Only Director Nettles was not present.

Deputy Rush reported some of the mailboxes located along Indian Point Drive had been broken into and packages stolen. The post office had been contacted about repairs and the constable's office would continue to patrol the area. Deputy Rush also stated he would check into a report of a vehicle parked at the swimming pool during early morning hours.

Ms. Johnson provided a review of bills passed during the regular Legislative session. She said her office would monitor the upcoming special session and report on any relevant bills passed.

The Board discussed an estimate of property value for the MUD office building, noting the terms of the SPA require the building be sold prior to Oct 1, 2019.

Mr. Swanks (filling in for Ms. Wheeler) reported that the installation of a safety fence along the back side of the box culvert in the SHW nature preserve was completed. He provided photos of the fence for the Board's review. Mr. Swanks informed the Board that the cleanout of Slaughter Creek was about two-thirds complete, and he estimated the project would be completed within the next two days. He also stated that there had been four water leaks in the District's system during the past month, including a water main break along Indian Point Dr. He added that SAMCO Leak Detection was in the process of inspecting the District's water lines for any additional leaks.
