Treasurer's Letter December

What's the financial plan for 2016?

As treasurer of the Shady Hollow Homeowner's Association, I wanted to take a moment to let each of you know about the proposed budget for Shady Hollow in 2016. The long and short of it remains that we expect HOA fees to increase to \$426 per year from 2015's \$398 per year or 7%. Why the increase? The short story is that we know there will be significant expenditures that the HOA will incur during the next five years. In order to pay for those future expenditures, we have to save up the money. A parallel in your personal life might look like the situation wherein you must set aside (reserve) monies for a major remodeling project because you can't afford to do the work all at once. It works the same way with your HOA. In the November newsletter we more fully described how and why we use the reserve study for planning purposes. Please refer to the newsletter for a more complete explanation of reserves and the reserve study.

The good news is that on a relative scale you are getting an excellent bang for your buck when it comes to homeowners fees. Let's look at what some of the surrounding communities pay for their homeowners' fees.

Circle C - \$584/per year

Bridges of Bear Creek - \$300-\$500/yr and they have no amenities unless you consider the brick wall on Brodie an amenity

Estates of Shady Hollow - \$125/yr with no amenities

Villages of Shady Hollow - \$440/yr and they have a pool

Belterra - \$500/yr

Travis Country - \$504/yr with amenities similar to Shady Hollow

Brodie Springs - \$600/yr with no amenities.

Traits of Good Board Members

Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

Respect. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

Good listening. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

Thick skin. Sometimes, residents—even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

Egos aside. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

Agenda aside. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise?

Skill. An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and teambuilding backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills and temperaments. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job. Fellow board members and managers can help you with the transition and train you on board responsibilities, current work, projects and hot issues.







From the Constable

Most burglaries can be prevented by following a few simple tips:

- Always lock your doors and windows, even when leaving for "just a minute."
- Never leave a house key under a doormat, in a flower pot, or on the ledge of the door.
- ▶ Be sure to use the dead bolt lock.
- Attach the strike plate (the jamb fastening that receives the bolt in the locking position) for the dead bolt to the door with four to six 3-inch brass wood screws that penetrate through the frame to the structural wood.
- Lock your side garage door at night and when you are away from home. Lock your garage door leading into the house.
- Keep your garage door closed. Thieves steal items from open garages in less than 30 seconds.
- Do not leave items of value outside your home. Thieves may take items from your porch, patio or yard. Use "ventilation" locks as well as auxiliary locks on sliding doors and windows to bolster security.
- All sliding glass doors and windows should be equipped with anti-lift protection.
- Remember, many burglaries occur with no force—burglars enter your home through unlocked doors and windows.
- Going Out? Lock all doors and windows at all times.
- ▶ Take your garage door opener with you.
- Use timers so that lights, radio, and TV go on and off throughout the house to indicate someone is home.
- For vacation, be sure to stop mail and newspaper or have a neighbor collect mail and newspapers daily. Make your house look "lived in."
- Remember, if you come home and see a broken window or jimmied door, don't go in.
- For your safety, phone Sheriff's Dispatch at 9-I-I for a deputy to respond.
- Please use your lens viewer in the front door at all times before answering the door.

- Never open the door without knowing who is there.
- Install motion sensor lighting around the perimeter of your house.
- ▶ Keep your porch lights on dusk to dawn.
- If you have an alarm system, use it at all times.
- Consider laminating windows and sliders to prevent breakage of windows.
- Consider having your locks changed if you give the key to someone performing any work in your home. When you have any type of work done on your home, even housecleaning, make sure all doors and windows are locked before you leave the home or when at home.
- Mark your valuables, using an engraver, with your driver's license number preceded by "TX" for Texas. This makes your property more difficult to pawn and helps law enforcement identify your property if it is recovered.
- Consider renting a bank safe deposit box or purchasing a safe for the home to safeguard valuables, such as jewelry, cash, coins, passports, birth certificates and other important documents.
- Keep landscaping around your home trimmed down around doorways, windows and light fixtures.
- Never leave a purse, wallet, or other valuables in plain sight.
- Always lock your car and take the keys out even when it is parked in your garage or driveway.
- Be alert and aware of your surroundings at all times.
