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# May Landscape Tips

# What a Fabulous Spring! By Kim Goyette

The Hill Country is peaking with spring color. The recent rains really pushed a flush of blooms that had been delayed due to the drought and extended cold weather. Now is the time to stay on top of your landscaping before the heat kicks in.

### Mulch

Now that leaf and pollen drop season is done it is time to start mulching your plants if you have not done so already. Avoid piling mulch up the trunk of a tree. This will invite insect and disease damage. Just pull it away from the trunk a couple of inches. The best design is a simple flat disc of mulch. A Volcano or Doughnut shape is not easy to maintain.



### Irrigation

Trying to get your plants established before the heat of summer is important. Deep, infrequent watering will get that done. Be sure to do a full "walk-thru" of your irrigation system. Turn on each station from the clock and inspect each head individually. Check for clogged nozzles, geysers, misaligned heads, underground leaks, valves that don't fully shut down (slow leaks) and poor coverage. Using an empty tuna can, you can measure the "inches per hour" of your system. During the heat of summer, it's recommended that you apply 3/4 to 1 ½ inches of water per week for turf (depends on soil depth and quality). This can be next to impossible if you can only water one day per week. No matter what your days are, using the run-soak-run system is best and prevents run off. Instead of watering a station 1 time per night, run it 3 times for 1/3 of the time. This improves water penetration and deeper roots.

### Turf

As it gets warmer, remember that St. Augustine should be mowed no shorter than 3 inches. The longer the blades, the more shade is applied to the soil surface and the root structure is at or just below the soil surface. This acts as mulch in the sense that is keeps the right amount of moisture and allows the roots and rhizomes to be protected from direct sun. Bermuda and Zoysia can be successfully maintained at a lower height, but keep in mind that if the height is taken too low too soon, the turf could brown out and going into the summer it may be difficult to reestablish.

### Beds

Pay attention to water and light requirements; most native perennials require full sunlight and very little water once established. If you have not done so yet complete your cutbacks in order to get more blooms. Remember to plant according to shade and soils conditions.

### Fertilizer and Weed Control

Finish up your post emergent weed control applications. Remember once it gets too hot the temperatures can cause the turf to stress and die back. Follow the label on all materials. Go ahead and apply a balanced fertilizer if you have not done so already. Get the grass, and shrubs, ready for the summer heat.

# **Shady Hollow Mud Meeting Minutes**

Date: February 21, 2024

**Persons present**: Michael Tomme, President; Adam Hughes, Secretary; Russell Downey, Treasurer; and Kimberli Schiess, Assistant Secretary; William Swanks, District General Manager; Ken Schroeder of Schroeder Engineering Company, the District's Engineer; Deputy Aranda of Precinct 3 of the Travis County Constable's Office

**Citizen communication**: Mr. Gottlieb was present to reiterate his interest in filling the seat vacated by former Director Sam Harper.

**Constable report**: Deputy Aranda said law enforcement had received reports of an individual who had been accosting joggers and other pedestrians within and around the District. He stated TCCO was monitoring the situation and would be attempting to directly identify the individual using unmarked cars and other techniques.

**Directors' reports regarding general District business**: The Board considered appointing Mr. Gottlieb to fill the current vacancy on the Board. After discussion, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Gottlieb to the board.

The Board discussed reconstituting its officer positions as required when a new director is elected to the Board. The Board voted and approved Director Tomme as President, Director Downey as Vice President, Director Hughes as Secretary, Director Schiess as Treasurer, and Director Gottlieb as Assistant Secretary-Treasurer.

**General Manager's Report**: Mr. Swanks said he would make the annual water and wastewater usage report to the City of Austin as required under the wholesale water and wastewater agreement between the District and the City.

He reported on the District's financial position and budget. He said there were no Directors' fee expenses for the month and the District's facilities have been operating normally.

He also reported on the status of the District's capital improvement plan--replacing all water meters throughout the District. He had published notice of the District's seeking bids for the project and he anticipated having bids available for the Board's next meeting. The bid acceptance, contract approval, and execution process was discussed.

Engineer's report on District facilities: District's facilities were functioning properly.

**Attorney's report**: The Board discussed the May Directors Election and Mr. Evans proposed the Election Order. The vote was unanimous. A copy of the Election Order would be posted at the District's regular polling places on Election Day.

Mr. Evans updated the Board regarding the status of the installation of traffic enforcement signs within the District. He had submitted a revised licensing agreement to Travis County and is awaiting a response. Mr. Swanks said he would coordinate with Shady Hollow HOA to install the signs.

Mr. Evans presented a proposal for renewal of the District's insurance coverage from Brown & Brown Insurance Services, the District's current insurance agent. Since no one from Brown was present to review the proposal with the Board, the matter was tabled until the next meeting.

Date: March 20, 2024

Evans, of the Law Office of Zachariah T. Evans, PLLC, the District's attorney.

**Citizen communication**: Two citizens were present to address the Board regarding smoke testing the District previously performed throughout the District to identify breaks or other problems within the integrity in the District's wastewater

Constable report: Deputy Aranda updated the board on staffing matters.

Directors' reports regarding general District business: District's bills and invoices were approved.

Mr. Toomey presented AVA's draft audit report for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2023. Mr. Toomey said AVA was issuing an unmodified opinion, which was the highest opinion the District could receive. He reviewed the Statement of Net Position and Revenues and Expenses, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balances with the Board. The Audit Report was approved and the District's Attorney would file it with the Comptroller, the Commission, in the District's office, and with all other governmental agencies as required.

Ms. Aday presented a proposal from Brown for renewal of the District's insurance coverage. She reviewed the District's current coverages in relation to current property valuations. The total premium would increase from \$9,524.00 for 2023-2024 to \$11,960.00 for 2024-2025. After questions from the Board and discussion, the proposal was unanimously approved.

**General Manager's Report**: Mr. Swanks reported that two waterline breaks were repaired over the previous month, but otherwise District's facilities had been operating normally. He also reported routine maintenance of the District's stormwater facilities would commence soon. Mr. Swanks said that one of the District's certificates of deposit would be expiring soon and he intended to reinvest the funds in U.S. Treasury bonds.

Engineer's report on District facilities: District's facilities were functioning properly.

**Attorney's report**: Mr. Evans updated the Board regarding the status of the installation of traffic enforcement signs within the District. He had submitted a revised licensing agreement to Travis County and was awaiting a response.

### Administration

- January HOA assessment dues were sent out and are due by January 31st.
- Total Architectural Improvement Permits for 2023 are 109 qty.
- Resale requests for home sales for 2023 were 35 qty.
- Total receivables outstanding as of December 31, 2023, total \$73,106.98

### Shady Hollow HOA – Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions:

- The primary covenant violation is contractor signs displayed in the front yard.

### PARKS/COMMON AREAS:

- The parks and Community Center were prepped for the recent freeze on 1/13/2024. Thankfully we did not see any immediate damage after.

- The Community Center carpets are scheduled to be cleaned in February. Use of the amenity has continued to increase.
- We met with Dobbs to discuss improvements to the Doe Run Basketball courts.

-Pickle ball has been extremely popular, and we have recently run out of Tennis keys! However, more have been ordered and we should have them next week.

- The recent inclement weather and wind caused some of the windscreens at both Tennis courts to fall down. We are working on securing them back in place, but have been delayed due to the rain.

- Basketball nets at Capistrano have been replaced.

- We also received a quote from Dunman Electric to have the lights for the Shady Hollow sign on Brodie fixed after being vandalized in July.

- The Polar Bear Swim was held at the pool on January 1<sup>st</sup> at 10AM. We had a fantastic turnout with over 50 people attending. If you did not receive a Polar Bear Plunge certificate, we still have some available at the office to be picked up.

- The pool was also prepped for the freeze and the diving boards were taken off.

- The Spa & Pool Shoppe continues to service the pool twice a week on Tuesday and Friday to maintain the pool during the off-season.

### January 2024 Treasure's Report – Geoff Lawson

#### Bank accounts/Balance Sheet

• Our register balance in our Chase Bank operating account as of 12/31/23 was **\$270,667.58**. The balance was reconciled to the QuickBooks ledger by both me and the Heyman CPA firm.

• Our reserve accounts as of 12/31/2023 held **\$19,299.70** in our Chase Reserve Account and \$200,000 (plus accrued interest) in our Chase CD and \$221,242.39 in our CD at TDECU. We transferred **\$9,308.00** from our operating account to our reserve account at Chase Bank in accordance with the funding plan detailed in our Jan 2021 reserve study.

### Revenue

• On a Cash Basis presentation, total revenue for the month ending 12/31/2023 was \$5,813.52 versus budgeted revenue of \$6,178.75.

• Overall, net income for the month of December 2023 aggregated to -\$41,479.12 versus projected net loss of - \$73,231.35.

### Expenses

• At this time, Rachel and I, are reviewing expenses to insure an accurate result and will supplement this report when our accountants (Heyman and Associates) have provided us with additional information.

### **MRI Expenditures**

• MRI expenses – There were no MRI expenses during the month of December.

- 6. Pool, David Anderson Did not meet, but updated the board to say that the diving boards have been removed. The pads where the bolts attached need to be replaced. One board is slippery and needs to be replaced. The bases need to be painted. We are still getting a little rust accumulating despite many attempts to prevent it. Some of the chairs and lounges need to be replaced as some have been tossed out from last year. The door barrier at the front gate has been approved, so Dave will work with Geoff to get this done. The old gate (side entrance) had a broken lock and was unlatched, so Dave put a lock in place.
- 7. Events, Jamie Rygg Did not officially meet yet, but we are planning for our next big event, Easter.
- 8. Traffic, Carl Hooker Not present.
- 9. Architectural Control, Jason Zirkle Did not meet.
- 10. Welcome, Mary Ellen Mathis Did not meet.
- 11. Long Range Planning Jim Downing Did not meet. Will leave discussion for new business item.
- 12. Ad Hoc Dog Park Committee Tom Ennis Did not meet.
- 13. Ad Hoc Hiring Process Committee Met on January 18<sup>th</sup> and will meet again on February 8<sup>th</sup>. After much discussion we have determined at this time that we would like to not move forward with hiring a Property Management Company, and we would like to continue the discussion to run our own hiring process to select the next Association Manager.

- The 2024 budget was discussed and presented.

- The HOA will not be raising assessments in January 2024, but will be rising slightly mid year (about 3 %). 2020 was the last increase.

- Recommended to move forward with another reserve study this year. It was suggested with previous boards to do ne every year, but 2-3 years should be sufficient.

- Motion to adopt the 2024 Annual Budget by Geoff Lawson, seconded by Russell Downey. Approval Unanimous.

#### - Discuss future projects

- Projects discussed and cost estimates are as follows:

- 1. Installation of fountain donated by Mr. Downs. Quote of \$3,500 by Gerardo Hernandez + \$500 in parts
- 2. Barrier behind Gazebo is deteriorating and needs to be replaced Quote \$7,500 by Gerardo Hernandez
- 3. Renew Doe Run Basketball Court \$31,000 bid, \$35,000 budgetary estimate
- 4. Sand Lot Volleyball Court \$55,000 bid, \$60,000 budgetary.
- 5. Seeding Wildflowers \$1000 \$3000 (Budgetary for 1-3 sites)
- 6. Art work on Doe Run Tennis Court Fencing/Gate \$1,050 quote, \$3,000 budgetary
- 7. Frisbee Golf Goals on open fields \$10,000 \$15,000 budgetary
