The City of Austin is proceeding with annexation of 80% of the Shady Hollow Homeowners Association (HOA) members without a vote. The City's Annexation will be completed in December 2020 unless the Texas Legislature gives all of our HOA members the right to vote on Annexation. The HOA's Annexation Committee has been busy fighting for the right of every HOA member to vote on annexation.

The Problem: The City of Austin is Annexing 80% of Shady Hollow Homeowners Because They Don't Get a Vote

In 2017, the Texas Legislature passed SB 6, which gave a vote to everyone except homeowners in Shady Hollow Municipal District! The other 20% of the homeowners are outside the district and get a vote so the City of

MUD News

The MUD Board held its regular monthly meeting on February 5, 2019 at the David C. Ellis Community Center, 3303 Doe Run. All directors were present.

Deputy Rush presented the monthly Constable's report. He reported on an incident at the Community Center in which a homeless man was discovered cooking in the kitchen without permission – the man resisted removal and assistance from other units was required. The man had an outstanding warrant and was taken into custody. Officers then checked the greenbelt area for homeless camps; none were located. In discussing a report of a suspicious vehicle, Deputy Rush emphasized that the first call any person makes in a questionable situation should be to 911. Mr. Romell (Maxwell Locke & Ritter) presented the draft of the District's audit for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, which he described as an unmodified opinion, the highest opinion the District can receive. The Board approved the audit as presented and authorized its filing with the TCEQ and other governmental agencies as required. Mr. Haag reported on recently filed bills being considered by lawmakers during the 86th Legislative Session. Director Tomme updated the Board on recent action by Rep. Vikki Goodwin regarding annexation issues.

The Board voted to enter into a 60-day contract with Christopher Watters International Realty regarding the sale of the District's office building on Capistrano, contingent upon the review and approval of the contract by the District's attorney.

Mr. Swanks stated that Tumco had inspected the detention pond in Gatling Gun Park after receiving word from the HOA that repairs might be needed. He reviewed a plan to mitigate the situation, and estimated the cost at \$5000. The Board voted to authorize Tumco to make the repairs as discussed.

The Constable's report for February included the following:

- Once again, the worst of the speeders was recorded on Green Emerald (48/30) [not as bad as January, which was 60/30, also on Green Emerald];
- Regular patrols of common areas, streets, school zones; spoke with residents jogging, walking dogs, using the parks; checked for stop sign, school bus & red light violations; checked for suspicious activity;
- Checked vehicle parked behind community center at 11:30 pm 2 kids talking (Doe Run); cited 2 young subjects for possession of drug paraphernalia (Edwards Hollow);
 - Assist EMS: contractor fell off roof transported to hospital (Reynosa).



Treasurer's Report - Geoff Lawson – Presented the results from the audit of our financial results from fiscal year 2018

- Our balance sheet ended 2018 with \$375,958 in cash. That is \$214,852 more than our balance at the end of Fiscal Year 2017.
 - For FY 2018, the excess of revenues over expenses was \$80,894 (net income).
- Total assets for FY 2018 were \$1,093,678. Total liabilities decreased to \$92,028 for FY 2018 from \$300,839 at FYE 2017.
 - We have no bank debt and no credit card debt.
 - We ended FY 2018 with \$1,001,650 in equity. This was an increase of \$80,894 over the previous year.
 - The association has grown much stronger financially over the course the past year.

Instant Pot Corned Beef and Cabbage ST. Patricks Day Recipe

Thanks to the pressure-cooker setting on the Instant Pot, you can make this St. Patrick's Day classic in under two hours. It yields succulent corned beef and tender cabbage every time. Serve with rye or rustic bread for sopping up all the delicious juices.

TOTAL TIME PREP 1 hour 45 mins, SERVINGS 8

- 1 teaspoon mustard seeds
- 1 teaspoon black peppercorns
- 1/2 teaspoon juniper berries (about 12)
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice berries (about 6)
 - 2 dried bay leaves
- 1 flat-cut corned beef brisket (3 to 4 pounds), trimmed of excess fat
- 1 yellow onion, peeled and quartered
- 3 cloves garlic, smashed and peeled
- 1 1/2 pounds carrots, peeled and cut into 3-inch pieces
- 1 1/2 pounds small red potatoes
 - 1/2 head green cabbage (1 1/2

pounds), quartered lengthwise

• Whole-grain mustard, for serving

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a mortar and pestle, coarsely crush mustard seeds, peppercorns, juniper, allspice, and bay leaves (alternatively, place in a resealable bag and crush with a rolling pin). Add to the bowl of a multicooker, along with brisket, onion, and garlic. Add enough water to completely cover brisket, about 8 to 10 cups. Secure lid of multicooker. Cook on high "Pressure Cook" setting for 1 hour, 25 minutes. Once time is complete, turn off machine and manually release pressure; carefully remove lid. Using tongs, transfer brisket to a cutting board; tent with foil to keep
 - 2. Add carrots, potatoes, and cab-

bage to bowl of multicooker. Secure lid, readjust pressure valve, and cook on high "Pressure Cook" setting for 5 minutes. Once time is complete, turn off machine and manually release pressure; carefully remove lid (do not let vegetables sit on the warming setting). Using a slotted spoon, transfer vegetables to a platter. Thinly slice brisket against the grain and transfer to platter. Spoon some of the cooking liquid over brisket and vegetables; serve with mustard.

Asking the Legislature to Fix the Problem

To prevent the City of Austin from splitting up Shady Hollow, we are asking the Texas Legislature to give everyone in Shady Hollow a vote on annexation. Senator Donna Campbell filed Senate Bill 1468 on Monday, March 4, 2019. You can track the bill's progress on the Texas Legislature website at https://capitol.texas.gov and search for "SB 1468."

Funding for a Lobbyist

Shady Hollow HOA cannot use its membership dues to pay a lobbyist to fix SB 6, so the Annexation Committee members have set up a Texas Unincorporated Nonprofit Association called Shady Hollow Vote for Everyone (SHAVE) to collect voluntary donations to hire a lobbyist to help get a bill passed to give everyone a vote on annexation. All donations will be used by SHAVE to pay the lobbyist, and to pay the administrative expenses of SHAVE, including governmental fees and insurance premiums. Donations are NOT tax deductible (SHAVE is not a charity).



Shady Hollow Former Board President Robert Donald Remlinger Obituary



Robert Donald Remlinger (Bob) born August 23, 1935, passed away February 24, 2019 surrounded by his loving family. Bob is survived by his loving wife of almost 60 years, Gayle L. Remlinger; son Donald S. Remlinger; son Robert E. Remlinger and his wife Janet Remlinger and granddaughters Jeanette, Mary, Anna and Lilly; daughter Laurinda L. Rohrer and her husband Michael P. Rohrer, granddaughter Nicole L. Lumley and her husband Trey Lumley and grandson Matthew R. Rohrer.

Bob and Gayle were married July 24, 1959 and then transferred to Waco, TX. All three of their children were born in the same hospital and delivered by the same doctor, which is very unusual for a military family. They were in Waco between 1960 and 1963. During two tours in Vietnam Bob flew F4 fighter jets. He flew 7 other types of planes as well as helicopters. Later Bob was stationed in Kansas, Arizona, California, Virginia, The Netherlands and finally ended up in Austin, TX at Bergstrom Air Force Base. He kept his promise to Gayle that he would retire from the Air Force somewhere in Texas near her family. While in the Air Force Bob served as a Radar Intercept Instructor, Military Training Instructor, Education and Training Instructor, Assistant Professor Aerospace Study, Wing Flight Commander, Commandant of NCO Academy, Air Operations Officer, Chief Protocol Officer and Logistics in the European Theater.

Bob was instrumental in getting funding for the Manchaca Fire Department and EMS facilities. Bob became involved in National Night Out in 1989 where he coordinated the Texas submission for the NNO program. The State of Texas won 10 of of the 11 years he served. He also was an Election Judge, Neighborhood Association President and S.A.L.T. (Seniors and Law Enforcement Together) and worked at the Soup Kitchen often. Bob was an encouragement to everyone he met. He was kindhearted, generous, loving and organized.

SHADY HOLLOW GENEALOGY CLUB

The Shady Hollow Genealogy Club meets at 7:00 p.m. on the 3rd Tuesday of odd-numbered months (January, March, May, July, etc.). The next meeting is scheduled for March 19th at the Downing home, 11132 Shady Hollow.

At the March meeting, we will view a video about William Owen Pile, born February 20, 1920, who fathered a daughter when he was 16. To escape the burden of his mistake he joined the Army and was assigned to the Air Corp where he became a B-26 pilot. He flew missions into Europe from England during the pre-invasion bombing for Operation Overlord. After the Normandy invasion he flew tactical bombing missions until he was lost in action during the Battle of the Bulge. His remains were declared "unrecoverable" until JPAC found the debris field from his plane and bits of bone. The Army needed to decide who should receive his remains since his immediate family had all passed away. Dorothy Estes, wife of William's distant cousin, undertook a genealogical research project during which William's granddaughter Elizabeth was found. She knew nothing of her grandfather or his war record. Elizabeth decided to have William's remains buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Jim Downing, a member of the research team, produced a video about William Pile called "A Long Road Home". The video has been presented at the past two Pile Family Reunions and was a main attraction at the 2017 and 2018 B-16 Marauder Historical Society annual reunions. The entire William Pile story is a wonderful example of how genealogical research can bring family members together – it can be much more than making charts and searching for unnamed distant relatives.
