Numerous organizations, some new and some old, are working to ensure elected officials and other influencers pay attention to south and southwest Austin. Here's a brief listing of those in which Shady Hollow participates:

South Brodie Neighborhood Alliance

Shady Hollow took the lead in creating this group comprised of the neighborhoods that open to Brodie between Slaughter and 1626, plus a few neighborhoods adjacent to us to the east. It meets 7 p.m. the second Thursday of each month at the Shady Hollow Community Center. SHHOA Board Member Pam Baggett created SoBro and is the coordinator.

The May meeting features a SH 45SW update from County Commissioner **Gerald Daugherty!**

Presidents Letter "Are you the One?"

Well, two months into my tenure as the Board President I've gotten a feel for what life on the Shady Hollow HOA Board will be like. Lots of little problems and a couple of bigger ones. I've been impressed that residents are attending Board meetings, and more impressed that the residents are approaching us about problems that have been ignored in the past. Being approachable may have gotten us some votes in the general election, being problem solvers may have gotten us some votes, being "brutally honest" may have even gotten me personally some votes.

Back to the title "Are you the One?".... Recently I accompanied Darin (our General Manager) on a drive through the neighborhood. It was a Tuesday and the mission "Trash Can Police/Covenants Violations" was my idea not his. Darin drives the neighborhood enough to know where the problem areas are, and where they aren't. Residents of the areas also know, which is what prompted me to spend some time seeing where and what the problems are. We ran out of notices after doing about ten percent of the general area. Seventy-five notices were posted! There are at least seventy five of you.

So, you may have noticed a note on your trash can, and if so it was because your neighbors complain about it, the Shady Hollow HOA Board hears about it, and it's apparent

5 Councilmember Ann Kitchen and her staff will be in attendance. It is 7 p.m. at the Onion Creek Country Club. Everyone is welcome to attend and participate.

OHAN: Oak Hill Association of Neighborhoods

This is the first organization south of the river created to represent neighborhoods to the city and county, going back to when most of the members were outside the city limits. SHHOA has always been a member and OHAN strongly supports SH 45SW. These meetings are tentatively scheduled for 7 p.m. the second Wednesday of each month. The default location is the ACC but actual locations vary according to availability. Former SHHOA board member Vikki Goodwin is the voting representative for SHHOA.

Austin Neighborhood Council

ANC is another long-standing organization, primarily representing central and north Austin. SHHOA joined last year and is encouraging other SoBro and SANA neighborhoods to join as well. SHHOA Board President Mike Cain is the voting representative for SHHOA.

Much like the need for the new 10-1 city council representation, ANA needs to hear from more than the same old group who opposes roads, in particular SH 45SW, and holds for the status quo. There are subgroups for the East Sector, South Central Sector,

The MUD Board held its regular monthly meeting on April 7, 2015 at the MUD Office Building, 3910 Capistrano Trail. All directors were present.

Corporal Tijerina from the Constable's Office reported on recent traffic monitoring, especially in school zones. He advised he is using a new laser radar system that is extremely accurate. He said there had been quite a few alarm calls in the past few weeks, but no actual burglaries.

The Board accepted the low bid for the lift station fence repairs and work will begin soon.

Ms. Wheeler informed the Board that the City of Austin had been doing repairs to one of its water lines and had accidently cut off water to the District without advance warning. She had her employees flush the lines and take water samples. Ms. Wheeler followed up with the city regarding the need for prior notice in the future.
